



RESIDENTIAL FENCE CHECKLIST

Fence shall not exceed property lines. Fences located behind the front building line may be a maximum of 8' in height. Fences crossing easements require prior approval. Products manufactured for other uses such as plywood, corrugated steel, chain link, barbed wire and fiberglass panels are prohibited as fencing materials.

Permit is required when replacing, repairing, moving, or installing a fence. When submitting for a fence permit please fill out the Permit Application and include two copies of plot plans/survey with an outline of where the fence is being installed. If using a Contractor they must register with the City of Murphy and pull the permit.
